VOCABULARY

Rushes	Unedited footage from a video recording.
Creative commons	copyright licensing scheme where the creator of an original work allows others to use it without seeking further permission
Storyboard	Planning document for video or animation in which each scene, or sometimes shot, is drawn.
Render	to create a 2-D image from a 3-D virtual scene
Export	To save media in a format such that it can be watched, listened to or read by others.
Rough cut	Video production put into sequence but without the attention to detail needed for the final cut.
Final cut	Stage of video production in which the footage is in its finished form in the editing software.

Steven Paul "Steve" Jobs (February 24, 1955 - October 5, 2011) was an American businessman, investor and co-founder and CEO of Apple Inc. He was the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of Pixar Animation Studios until it was bought by The Walt Disney Company. He was the largest shareholder at Disney and a member of Disney's Board of Directors. He was seen as a leading figure in both the computer and entertainment industries. In August 2011, Jobs resigned, and was appointed Chairman of Apple. He served in that position until he died in 2011
