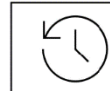


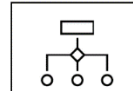
WHAT SHOULD I ALREADY KNOW?

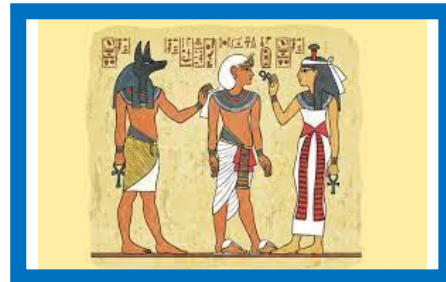

VOCABULARY

pharaoh	The word pharaoh originally meant 'great house', but came to mean the person who resided in it. It was used as the title of Egypt's rulers.
archaeologist	A person who discovers our history by looking at artefacts that have been found.
mummy	Remains of a body that have been preserved by embalming and drying
Canopic jar	Jars that held the internal organs to preserve them for the afterlife.

Howard Carter discovered the tomb of Tutankhamun in 1922.	Tutankhamun was an Egyptian pharaoh.
