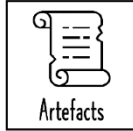
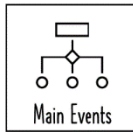
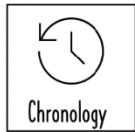

VOCABULARY DOZEN

Catholic	Relating to the church universal. The oldest and largest branch of Christianity Sometimes call Roman Catholic.
Dissolution	The dissolving of an organisation by termination or destruction.
Influence	The power to have an important effect on someone or something.
Heir	A person who has legal claim to a title or a throne when the person holding it dies.
Monastery	The name given to a collection of countries: Denmark, Norway and Sweden.
Protestant	A member of one of the Christian churches that separated from the Roman Catholic Church in the 16th century.

The Tudors came to power after the Battle of Bosworth when Henry Tudor defeated Richard III.	Henry VIII had 6 wives: Catherine of Aragon, Anne Boleyn, Jane Seymour, Anne of Cleves, Kathryn Howard, Katherine Parr.
Henry married six times because he wanted a male heir.	The Tudors reigned England from 1485 to 1603..
Henry split the English Church from the Roman Catholic Church. and declared himself as head of the Church of England	Henry closed down the wealthy Roman Catholic Abbeys, convents and monasteries and took ownership of the buildings, land and money
