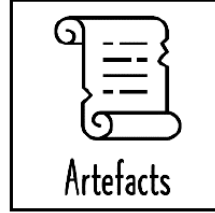
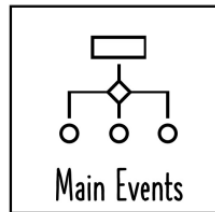
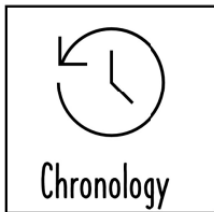




WHAT SHOULD I ALREADY KNOW?

Adolf Hitler was the leader of Germany during World War II.	World War II began in 1939 and ended in 1945.
Winston Churchill became Prime Minister of Great Britain in 1940.	Neville Chamberlain was Prime Minister at the beginning of World War II.
In World War II the Allies consisted of Great Britain, France, Russia and USA and the Axis powers were Germany, Italy and Japan.	When he was younger Adolf Hitler had ambitions to be an artist.

VOCABULARY

Anti-Semitism	Hostility or prejudice against Jewish people.
Nazi	A member of the National socialist German Workers' Party
Luftwaffe	Part of the German armed forces tasked with the air defence of Germany. It means "air weapon" in German.
Holocaust	The killing of six million Jews by Nazi Germany during World War II
Dunkirk	A small coastal town in France from which British soldiers were evacuated.
Dictator	A political leader who has absolute power.
D-Day	This was a large invasion with over 5,000 ships and 150,000 troops landing on five beaches in Normandy, France.
Evacuee	A person who is removed from a place of danger.

Key People

Sir Winston Churchill - (1874-1965) was a British politician who served as the Prime Minister between 1940 and 1945 (most of World War II) and again from 1951 to 1955. He took over in May 1940, after a disastrous start to the war in which Nazi Germany had conquered much of Europe. He did his best to rally the nation in defiance of Adolf Hitler, possessed excellent military knowledge and forged crucial alliances with both the USA and Russia.



Adolf Hitler - (1889-1945) was a German politician who was the leader of the Nazi party, Chancellor of Germany from 1933-1945, and the Führer of Germany from 1934-1945. Hitler's Germany invaded Poland in September 1939 to start the war, and it was he who initiated the Holocaust. He is therefore significantly responsible for the deaths of millions. He committed suicide on 30th April 1945, when it was clear the war was lost.
