Drag Back	The drag back is a great turn when

	can be quite challenging because we
	don't often make this type of
	movement. Many invasion games

Step Over	A move in football to dribble past a
	player. Send an opponent in the
	opposite direction by using a step
	over turn.
Stop Turn	The stop turn is a great skill to use
	to try and keep the ball in play
	before it runs over the sideline or to
	leave a defender behind.
Strategy	An approach to take or a tactic that
	a team will use and decide on.
