<u>VOCABULARY</u>

Back stitch	A method of sewing with overlapping stitches.
Fasteners	Used to hold pieces of material together such as a button or zip.
Pattern	Used as a template for cutting out pieces of textile product.
Seam	The line where to two pieces of material are sewn together.

STITCHES

Stitches:

Running stitch (simple stitch consisting of a line of small even stitches)

Overstitch simple stitch consisting of the thread going over the edge of the fabric, usually used to stop a fabric from fraying.

Cross stitch (pairs of diagonal stitches cross each other in the middle to form an X).
