### STICKY KNOWLEDGE

- Counties: Staffordshire, Shropshire, Cheshire, Derbyshire, Leicestershire, Worcestershire, Warwickshire, Cornwall.
- Cities: Manchester, London, Liverpool, Edinburgh.
- England is divided up into 'regions' and 'counties'.
- A county is a smaller area of the UK containing lots of towns and villages.
- England is divided up into 48 counties.
- Counties are the top level of local government controlling the local area and services such as education, transport, policing and fire.
- A city is the largest type of settlement, containing lots of buildings and lots of people. They usually have hospitals, sports facilities, universities, shops, offices, many houses and a cathedral.
- Using a four-figure grid reference helps to narrow an area to search, making it easier to locate features on
