


Rainforest Locations



Sticky Knowledge

The Tropical rainforest blome has four main characteristics:

- Very high annual rainfall
- High average temperatures
- Nutrient-poor soil
- High levels of biodiversity



One third of the world's tropical rainforests are in Brazil. Other tropical rainforests are located in Southeast Asia and the Pacific Islands (25% of the world's tropical rainforests) and West Africa (18%) Temperate rainforests are found along some coasts in temperature zones.

Rainforests are ecosystems filled with mostly evergreen trees that typically receive high amounts of rainfall. Tropical rainforests are found near the equator, with high average temperatures and humidity, while temperate rainforests lie mostly in coastal, mountainous areas.
