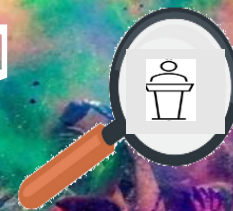

WHAT SHOULD I ALREADY KNOW?

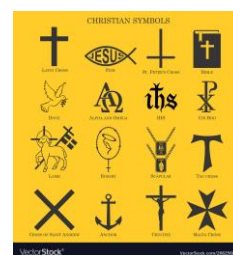
- I know that Christians gather to worship in a church.

VOCABULARY

Mitre	a tall headdress worn by bishops
Bishop	a senior member of the Christian clergy, usually in charge of a diocese and empowered to confer holy orders.
Cathedral	a church that is the official seat of a diocesan bishop

STICKY KNOWLEDGE


Her Majesty the Queen is the Supreme Governor of the Church of England.	The Church is led by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York.
Cathedrals are the mother churches of their dioceses and act as focal points for services and celebrations for those worshipping in churches throughout the diocese.	Bishop Michael was enthroned as the 99th Bishop of Lichfield on 24 September 2016.
