### STICKY KNOWLEDGE

Worship is not about an emotion; it is more about a recognition of a God. An act of worship may be performed individually, in an informal or formal group, or by a designated leader.	Muslim worship is about showing devotion to Allah. Most Muslims believe worshipping together has more value than worshipping alone as it strengthens the sense of community.
When they pray Muslims face the direction of the Ka'bah in Mecca.	Christians worship God in order to thank him for his love, ask for forgiveness for their sins and to try to understand what God wants from them.
